Using hand and machine techniques of knitting and crochet, Lauren's work explores the intersection between art, craft and design. Her work has an organic and playful approach with a strong connection to the hand. She has a BA in Art (Textile Design), and has previous experience in the field of textiles design, fashion, homewares and costume design. Her work has been exhibited nationally in both solo and group exhibitions, with her most recent solo exhibition 'The Feelings Mutual' showing in 2022 supported by Regional Arts Council Victoria.
