

Sky Jasper Mooney *Untitled* – The Corner Store Gallery March 15 - 26

"Hovea Rock Scramble" is a triptych by Sky Jasper Mooney showcasing the rugged beauty of Western Australia through acrylic on board paintings. The limited palette of ultramarine blue, burnt sienna, raw umber, and cadmium yellow highlights the region's ancient rocks, swaying gum trees, and grass trees, creating a stunning representation of the landscape. The artwork captures the essence of Hovea and its natural beauty through a harmonious use of colour and texture.

Sky Jasper Mooney is a painter who draws inspiration directly from his observed surroundings and is heavily influenced by the impressionist movement, which originated in Europe and spread to Australia. Carrying the torch for this style, Jasper incorporates its principles into his modernday paintings, creating a unique and contemporary spin on a classic art form.

Jasper's work is a product of his observations, as every mark he makes is a reference to something seen. Through his paintings, he explores line, tone, and value, creating works that are not only visually stunning but also serve as a representation of his experiences in life.
